

The Weekly Bulletin for Sunday 29th October 2017

As we start our week of considering how we give of our time, talents & particularly our money to help grow God's Kingdom, our Give to Grow Consultant Eileen Askham, shares the following by Rick Warren:

One time, when I was 8 years old, I went into a thrift store and bought my mother a dress for 25 cents. I thought it was a really cool dress. It was about a size 4 and my mom was a size 12. The clerk said to me, "*Ricky, your mom couldn't get her big toe in that dress.*" I was so offended and went home crying. When I gave the dress to my mom, she was so thrilled. When she died, I found that dress in one of her chests. She'd kept it all those years.

There's nothing you can give God that he needs. But when you give him an offering, you're saying, "*God, I love you. I'm thinking of you. I want you first in my life.*" If you want to measure how much you understand grace and how much you're living by grace, look at your giving. The Bible says, "*Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work*" (2 Corinthians 9:7-8 NIV). Notice the "alls" - "all grace," "all things," "at all times," "having all that you need" - those are the promises related to the person who becomes like Christ. What was Christ like? He was a giver. God loved the world so much that he *gave*. Until you learn to be generous with your time, money, resources, and opportunities, you're not going to be like Christ.


Nothing is greater proof that you understand grace than being lovingly gracious and generous to other people and to God.

GIVE TO GROW BULLETIN:


