
I am attempting (badly!) to read the bible in one year using the BIOY app on my iPad & iPhone. Last weekend, I was struck by the following:

I Corinthians 12v1-26 The commentary told me that we are not intended to live alone. God created us for community – a community as close and as interdependent as the various parts of the human body. People come into the church from all different backgrounds, nationalities and positions in society Yet regardless of where we have come from, we now belong to one another. Our relationships are as intimate as the different parts of a body. We are utterly dependent on each other. The more different we are, the more we need each other. Variety is essential. God has designed the body so that there will be this mutual dependence: 'For no matter how significant you are, it is only because of what you are a part of (vv.19–20, MSG). Because we need each other so much there should be 'equal concern for each other' (v.25). There should be such intimacy and love that 'if one part suffers, every part suffers *with it'* (v.26a). This is the community we need where people can process their pain. It is also a place where people can share their joys: As St Augustine said, 'Take away envy and what I have is yours too. And if I banish envy all vou possess is mine!'

As you will see inside, many of our Fellowship have had a difficult summer with their health. Others have experienced difficulties we are not all aware of. It's been encouraging to hear of the warmth of the fellowship as you have supported & encouraged each other, no matter how different we may be.

*"Lord, help us to demonstrate such a unity, love and intimacy with our brothers and sisters that makes Christ beautiful to the world. Amen"*
