## The Weekly Bulletin for Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> September 2018

Earlier this year, we appointed Karen Read as our first Children's & Family Worker to develop the already successful Toddlers, Baby Song & Friday Club & build deeper relationships with the children & their families. Here Karen tells us something of her first 4 months in post.

*"The first 4 months of my job as The Children and Families worker, has just flown by. It took a while to get to know all the children and the parents that come through our doors on a weekly basis, as we have about 70 families linked to Toddlers, Baby Song and Friday Club, but I think I'm getting there. We have a very committed group of volunteers who help week by week & some who are willing to help out at short notice, to make these groups a huge success and without them we wouldn't have the opportunity of inviting these families into our building and being able to talk to them on a regular basis. I would like to thank them for all they have done and all they continue to do."*

*Last week we held our Summer Activity morning, where our theme was Noah's Ark. We had various activities set out around the room and the children moved around choosing what they wanted to do. Part way through we had a snack and then sat down to watch the DVD of Noah's Ark. A story that some of them had never seen before. After singing some songs, we closed the morning with a group prayer, where we used the Prayer Lion we had made during the morning. The morning was very successful and gave us opportunities to talk to the families and tell them that God looks after each and every one of us."*

*As we start a new term, we will have new children and families coming along to each of these groups and I ask that you will continue to pray for them all and for the volunteers who meet with them week by week".*

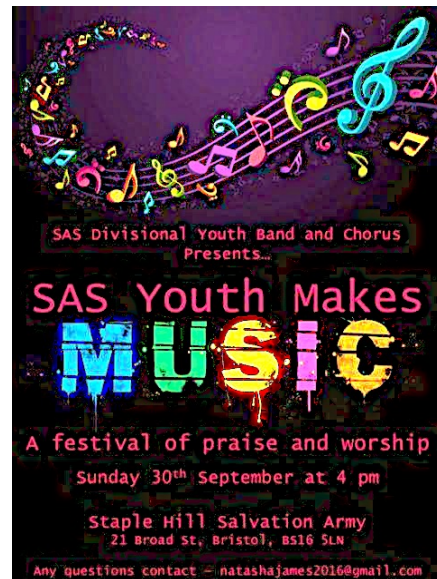
