### The Weekly Bulletin for Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> September 2018

I have been challenged this week by the relevance & meaning of last Sunday mornings bible text: Luke 16:19-3 *'The Story of the Rich Man & the Beggar'* Nicola was very clear in her sermon of the consequences of how we treat other people especially those who find themselves in situations similar to the beggar in Luke. In fact, the principles apply to how we treat each other irrespective of each others individual circumstances. We considered it again at our *'All Together'* Cell Group on Wednesday evening which has caused me to think further. We want to be a friendly, hospitable fellowship that welcomes everyone – people we know & people we've yet to meet. God has called us all to be members & participants of the Staple Hill Salvation Army – we're not here by accident. We each bring our skills, talents, interests & life's experiences to serve those God will lead to us.

*"There are more than 2 million people in this country earning the minimum wage today. Another 4.8 million people are self-employed, while millions of others get by on part-time wages. That adds up to a lot of people living from hand to mouth", for who it takes only a small jolt to be in financial jeopardy"*

Galatians 2:10 says: *'All they asked was that we should continue to remember the poor, the very thing I was eager to do'*. Are we eager to remember the poor or we sometimes overwhelmed or too preoccupied to know what to do? But we must not be put off. As the bible says, keep remembering the poor.

This will be an opportunity for them to leave the day-to-day management of our Church to one side & consider the bigger picture. Please pray for them as God leads them & continues to divulge His plan for us & his work to be done.

## EVENTS BULLETIN:


