It was good to hear Joe Saint give his first 'talk' in Band Practice on Tuesday evening. Not just interesting but challenging too. Here are some of his words:

***"Life is busy and this world is noisy.** Giving God the first moments of our days can be very challenging when you are a busy person and you have many commitments. But with intentionality, you can do it and the rewards are amazing! God is the source of everything we need. We have no power or strength on our own and that's why we need to spend time with Him every day. I wish I could say I get up at 5 am every day to spend time with God, but I'd be lying. Some days I find it really hard to even open my eyes before 8am! But no matter what time I get up I still give Him the first minutes of my day.*

***Life gets in the way.** We start our days early to prepare to go to our jobs or college or university. Once home from an exhausting day, we fall onto the sofa. Before you know it, you're falling asleep through the programme you promised to watch and decide to call it a night. Already tired from the day, you begin to think about what tomorrow holds and begin to feel exhausted before it's even started and so you go to sleep. It is hard to stop and make time to feed ourselves in the Word of God or spend time in solitude with Him.*

Last year at Uni, we studied the things that we did each day without really thinking about it. We were asked to improve them to make our experience better. Why not do the same with God? If we truly step back from our day, we can see endless amounts of possibilities & opportunities that there are to spend time with God. Whether that be your commute to work or a prayer before bed".


