Pick 30 people from 24 different countries across 5 continents and place in a retreat centre for 6 weeks and what do you get? The first session of the ICO was opened by General Albert Osbourn in 1950 and since that time approximately 6500 officers have had the privileged to attend.

The General Osbourn wrote: "The ICO is an investment in the great intangibles, without which our cogs and wheels would soon be rusty and dead."

I was part of part of the 241st session and maybe I was a great intangible?

Throughout the 6 weeks we had an opportunity to nurture our faith journey, meet the international leaders of our Church and gain a greater

understanding of the challenges facing the Salvation Army, along with those living and leading in developing countries, but where the Church is growing. 
