## **EMERGENCY COVID FOOD BANK:**

Throughout the Pandemic until 21<sup>st</sup> June 2021, we operated an emergency COVID food bank. We are so grateful to all those who helped with this project, either by helping 'make up' and 'give out' parcels or supporting practically with donations. As the project has now come to an end, we felt that you would like to know how many parcels were given out and how many people were helped.

From March 2020 - June 2021 we gave out 1149 food parcels, helping 1685 adults and 461 children. Each parcel provided enough food for 10 meals, so over the time that the project was running we provided over 20,000 meals. This was a massive achievement, and we are so thankful for all your support and encouragement. Over the coming weeks we will be assessing the ongoing need for this type of project as part of our programme review.

## **PROGRAMME REVIEW:**

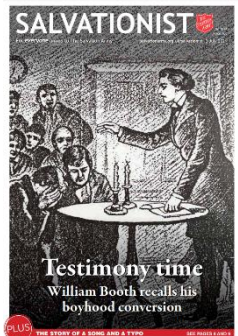
As restrictions are hopefully lifted and there is more freedom, we are reviewing all our pre-COVID programme activities. To help us achieve this it is our intention to identify the most important parts of our programme. This could be explained by taking an empty bucket and rather than filling it with smaller pebbles so there is no room for larger ones, we are wanting to place the larger pebbles in first and then place the smaller ones after.

Over the pandemic we have been sending information out concerning our worship hall renovations and an informal uniform, but from conversations it has been evident that many of you have missed this information. As we are still restricted in our opportunities of meeting together, we feel that we need to find a way in to canvas opinion more successfully. Following the Mission Council meeting on Monday, it was felt that we should use the Extra Slice groups to share and garner information, along with praying for the corps.
