# Our Last Sunday in Page Hall – Update on the Property Project

It has been a long wait, but finally we're moving back into our building and it will be exciting to be 'home' but also to have much better facilities. Here's what you need to know:

- The building is looking really good new paint, flooring, lights, doors, toilets, radiators etc. make it look fresh and welcoming
- Our two main aims of the project have been realised:
  - o More flexibility
    - Main Hall portable platform, along with flexible AV screens, lights and glass partitions, means the set up can be made suitable for any purpose
    - Easier access to upper rooms making them much more useable
    - During the week An extra room or larger foyer has been created to enable a much more appropriate space for community work (including a coffee machine worth £3,500 which we were given for free!)
  - More seating capacity
    - The addition of the gallery with 60 seats
- Unfortunately, the project is not quite complete the following will be completed by January:
  - o Above the gallery so we will have less capacity over December
  - 2 sets of sliding glass doors that creates the new room and larger foyer
  - AV & tech screens etc. we will continue to use the equipment used in Page Hall – which may mean you don't have an easy view.
  - Finishing touches signs, noticeboards, crest, window blinds, extra furniture, etc.
- Safety restrictions there are small elements that may seem strange
   but are necessary due to building regulations and will keep us all safe

- 'You can't please all of the people all of the time'! Those that have made decisions have done their best, consulted widely and worked incredibly hard – please encourage them!
- We are really grateful to The Harry Crook Foundation which made this work possible, funding a project that will benefit the community of Staple Hill, and we look forward to what the future holds!

Finally – please think about how you can fundraise to provide the last bit of funding needed – thank you!

# **Our Online Ministry**

We occasionally make reference to the reach of our online ministry during our weekly services, but few people would appreciate quite how significant has become. We are thankful to our fabulous Tech Team for enabling this for us .... a new, truly global frontline for our corps!

During the month of November (so far):

- Our online services have been viewed by 836 unique devices
