The month of July sees the long awaited International Congress come to London. Many of us will have the opportunity to attend some of the activities organised. If you are not able to travel to London, you can still take part by joining together in the streamed event on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> July.

The theme for the congress is 'Boundless - The whole world

redeeming'. As I am writing this, many Salvationists from all over the world and from many different cultures will be making their way to London to join together in a celebration of praise for all that God has done through The Salvation Army in the last 150 years.

The title comes from 'O Boundless Salvation' the well-known song written by our Founder, William Booth. It was written as a result of a sleepless night in 1893 as he meditated on the salvation that Jesus brings. The song was sung for the first time that year at the Boundless Salvation Campaign meetings in Exeter Hall. William Booth also used the song as part of his 83<sup>rd</sup> birthday celebration, which was to be his last public appearance in May 1912. Boundless is a great word - it means 'having no boundaries, without limits' and as such speaks to us of God's boundless love, grace, mercy and salvation. Whether we are travelling to London or not - this boundless nature of God is available to us all and maybe we can grasp again the awesomeness of this for ourselves

Accommodation will be basic but clean and will have both running water and sanitary facilities. But you will see some of the challenges of Kenya and some of the need. You will attend worship at one of the Army's Corps (probably in Nairobi) and see the children at work in some of the schools we have built or refurbished.

The holiday will conclude with two days on Safari where you will have a chance to see some of Africa's famous wildlife.

The cost will be in the region of £1200 per person and the party will be led by one of the Kenya Trust Trustees.

### Orders & Regulations for Bands



- There will be a chap out the front waving his arms around. He's called the Bandmaster. DO NOT WAVE BACK.
- 2. All bandsmen should attempt to play from the same Tune Book.
- Observe the 'repeat' signs ONLY if you think a passage is worth repeating.
- 4. If everyone gets lost except you, play LOUDER.
- If you hit a wrong note, GLARE at the bandsman next to you. Keep glaring. Do not back down.
- 6. The right note at the wrong time is still a wrong note.
- A wrong note, played with AUTHORITY, is simply your interpretation.
- Ignore markings for 'slurs', 'dynamics' and 'accidentals'. They are only there to make the score look more complicated.
- If a march is hard, slow down. If it's easy, speed up. Everything averages out.
- When everyone else stops playing, you should stop. Don't play any left-over notes.
- 11. Never, under any circumstances, pass on the tune number.
- 12. If you're unsure, play LOUDER.
- Keep your eyes down or closed. Watching the Bandmaster only stifles your artistic interpretation,
- 14. Don't make eye contact with the Bandmaster. He'll stop all the fun stuff.
